CENSUS 2016 It Benefits Us All



Tuesday, May 10, 2016 is National Census Day

It is vital that each resident in communities associated with the Northern Association of Community Councils (NACC), other northern communities and elsewhere in the province is counted in the 2016 Census. Everyone residing in Manitoba on Census Day needs to be included in the Census, even people who aren't citizens of Canada.

The information collected by the Census and its companion, the Long-Form, gives us a snapshot of individual Manitoba communities. This community picture is extremely important in guiding the decisions provincial and federal governments make about funding, planning and policies for our communities. Local community leadership, businesses and other agencies also use this information to help respond to needs of communities and the marketplace.

Every person missed means community projects may not receive as much support as they should. Funding opportunities will be lost that could affect education, health and social programs, and infrastructure renewal projects. Funding for these important programs is tied to population numbers so it is important that you and each of your household members are included.

Taking part in the 2016 Census is easier than it has ever been before. The forms are shorter, available in English, French and other languages. Your household can complete the form online or on paper. The confidentiality of your responses to the Census is protected by law. You can be assured that your household's Census information will not be shared with anyone!

The Manitoba Bureau of Statistics (MBS) will again be actively promoting the importance of participating in the Census. MBS wants all Manitobans to understand that the Census is more than just a simple head count. Full participation is worth more than just bragging rights. Each person ultimately missed would cost the province \$46,000 in Federal transfer payments over the next five years. Your community would also lose direct payments from a community undercount.

What makes a single person worth \$46,000? Population numbers based on census figures determine how many of our tax dollars will flow back to Manitoba in the form of transfer payments between now and the next census in 2021. The Census also determines how the province distributes gas taxes to Manitoba cities, towns and municipalities. One can certainly see why full participation is in the community's interests. Voting stations are open from 7:00am to 8:00pm on election day.

CAN I VOTE IF MY NAME IS NOT ON THE VOTERS LIST?

* Yes, if you are an eligible voter, you can still vote. Bring a Government-issued photo ID or two other documents with your name to bring to the voting place and sign an oath.

If your name is on the voters list, you do not require identification
