NHFI BEESWAX WORKSHOP, 2016



The current NHFI bee keepers were invited to a special Beeswax Workshop where beekeepers learned how to make soap, candles, and lip balm out of beeswax!

The day was filled with learning, laughter, and fun! At the end of the workshop each participant went home with soap, candles, and lip balm that they had created themselves.

Learning how to make these beeswax items was a great way to introduce more uses of beeswax that is produced in the hives. On average, there is 1 pound of beeswax produced to every 10 pounds of honey!

NHFI FALL COMMUNITY VISITS



The NHFI Fall Community Visits were held in Dauphin River, Homebrook, Waterhen, Mallard, Meadow Portage, Spence Lake, Crane River, Rock Ridge, Camperville, Barrows, and Duck Bay.

Participants of these workshops were able to learn a variety of different topics. Some highlights were "Greenhouses" and "Growing in a Greenhouse". We provided participants with a presentation and handout on how to successfully grow in a Greenhouse! Homebrook just purchased a greenhouse this year and was very excited to learn how to make seed starting pots out of recycled newspaper that can be started in the greenhouse.

Seed Saving was a hit where community members learned how easy and effective it is to save seeds of a plant that had desirable characteristics and almost guarantee that the same plant will grow again next year!



NHFI GROW NORTH REGIONAL CONFERENCE

A Grow North Regional Conference was held in Dawson Bay in the beginning of October. We learned how to Build a Greenhouse, the Basics of Beekeeping, and Traditional Home Remedies were presented and participants from Dawson Bay,

Duck Bay, and Barrows enjoyed the day long conference.

NEW PLAYSTRUCTURE FOR MEL JOHNSON SCHOOL IN WABOWDEN

November 7, 2016 will be a day remembered by our students.

Mel Johnson School students and staff were very pleased to finally see their new play structure completed and take part in the ceremony of cutting the ribbon to officially open the play structure.

Mel Johnson School's last play structure was installed in the early 70's, and with letters from the young students to the School Committee asking for their assistance on getting some new play ground equipment, action was taken.

Community Places was approached for a grant for this purpose, which was approved with the specification that Wabowden provide 50% of the costs. 50% of the costs were provided with the help of Frontier School Division along with the Wabowden Community Council, Mrs. Vivian Clarke (a former resident of Wabowden) and Mel Johnson School Committee. Along with the donations several local volunteers came out to assist in assembling the structure. The play structure became a reality for our students.

On hand for the cutting of the ribbon was Mrs. Clarkes' daughter Yvonne Kyle. Present for the ceremony was Reg Meade, Mayor of Wabowden, Mel Johnson School Committee, Mel Johnson students and staff, local volunteers and community members

The Premier Brian Pallister, Lynn Lake Mayor James Lindsay and the Minister of Infrastructure Mr. Blane Pederson announced on October 31st, 2016 that Provincial Road 391that connects Thompson to Lynn Lake will be renamed after Tom Cochrane.

Tom Cochrane is originally from Lynn Lake, Manitoba and is a recognized rock star, the 322– kilometre highway will be named after Tom Cochrane and his hit song "Life is a Highway". PR 391 will be renamed "Tom Cochrane's Life is a Highway".

Dauphin; Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) Project

This is a key Capital Project of Prairie Mountain Health (PMH). The \$3.7 million dollar project with Dauphin Regional Health Care Centre (DRHC) began construction of the addition in May, 2016 and is on track to be completed in the spring of 2017.

The new MRI suite consist of a 2,500 square foot addition to the DRHC and a basement, this addition is expected to add a capacity of almost 3,700 exams per a year for residents of the north-western region.
