NACC Executive Board and Executive Director to review and provide notification 4 months in advance of the Annual General Conference.

Motion to approve Ammendment: 43 Affirmative 4 Negative 1 Abstention

Conversations:

Rough estimate that impact on the Association would be approximately \$20,000. Harold Fleming spoke on behalf of NACC Board that there has not been funding increase for 15 years. Karen Kristiansson...in defense of the board, cost was estimated at \$26,000 and NACC had not yet rec'd their funding for 2025/26. Reg asked when the bylaw was changed to take per diems off the table. Asked if he could leave and assign someone to vote for him. Hopes that only elected officials can vote.

Amendment to the per diem motion Dale Einarson. amendment that NACC to determine annually if per diem are to be paid. Karen Kristiansson added to the amendment stating that NACC is to let communities know 4 months in advance as to whether the budget allows for per diems to be paid. Harold Fleming suggested that we follow the Department and not cover per diem. Brian Shepka, asked per diems are being removed or picked up by the communities?

Amendment 2: Bylaw 4. (d) (iv) (1) Only elected officials of a community council, an incorporated community or an appointed settlement contact person, shall have the right to: 1. Be a voting Delegate 2. Be elected to hold an elected office in the Association. Motion to remove the proposed amendment of the bylaws from discussion and voting. Tabled by Chair / MC. Approved by Diane Trumbla 2nd by Dave Olson
