Wild Goose	from Bev Trumbla
Servings: 2+ Prep tim	e: 15 min Cook time: varies
INGREDIENTS	DIRECTIONS
2 cups chicken broth	1.Rub inside of goose with sal
1 goose, plucked	& pepper as best you can.
salt & pepper, to taste	2.Loosely put the sliced
2 apples, slices	onions, apples and celery
1 onion, sliced	inside the goose. Brush
2 stalks celery,	bacon drippings or
chopped	margarine lightly over entire
bacon drippings or	body.
margarine	3.Place bacon slices on breast
4 bacon slices	Cover bird in aluminum foil
